Teaching:

I teach a great variety of topics in courses and lectures (BA to doctoral level) ranging from the Neolithic period to the late Iron Age (La Tène period) in Europe, covering a broad geographic area including central Europe, southeast Europe, southern Scandinavia and the British Isles.

In the course of my career, I had and have the privilege to supervise many inspiring students, postgraduates, and early career researchers (resulting in so far 11 completed Doctoral dissertations; 64 completed Master’s dissertations; many Bachelor’s dissertations; 2 completed Habilitation dissertations). Currently I am supervisor of 16 ongoing doctoral dissertations and 1 habilitation project.
